Martin County, Florida, seeks a Community Redevelopment Attorney. Hello Everyone!

I have just returned from Washington, D.C. where on Tuesday, February 28, 2006, David Steinfeld and I were admitted to the Bar of the United States Supreme Court and sworn in as members of that Bar by Chief Justice John Roberts. Not only did we participate in the swearing-in ceremony, which was a highlight of my professional career, but we were also able to observe two oral arguments before the Court, one involving a Vermont law which sought to limit campaign expenditures in State elections, and the other matter being the now infamous Anna Nicole Smith case.



For those of you who have never been to the Supreme Court, it is a spectacularly impressive building, and an architectural gem. We entered the Court building at about 8:15 a.m., and I was fortunate enough to have my wife, Kelly and my daughter, Lauren in attendance with us, so that they too could witness the swearing-in ceremony and arguments. The admittees and their guests were then escorted to the Court's Bar admissions office, where we signed in, paid our fees, and received instructions as to how the events of the morning will take place. The admittees and their guests receive special seating in the Court, and each admittee is entitled to have one guest, who is not required to wait in line to observe the Court proceedings, as is the general public. Once one is admitted to the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States, there is a special entrance to the courtroom for members of the Court's Bar who wish to observe oral argument, and they are therefore not required to wait in line with the general public, a line which on this day was well outside the courthouse doors before we ever arrived.

We were escorted into the beautiful Supreme Court courtroom, where we were seated in the first three rows directly behind counsel table. Upon the arrival of the justices, two opinions were read, one by Justice Breyer and one by Justice Thomas, and immediately following those opinions being read, the swearing in ceremony began. We were fortunate enough to have Gregory Katsas, the Deputy Solicitor General, and a good friend of Alan Forst, as our sponsor, and he made the motion to admit us to the Chief Justice. Following the making of all of the motions with respect to the admittees, by their respective sponsors, the oath was administered to the group by the Chief Justice, and the Chief Justice welcomed all of the new admittees to the Bar of the Court. At the conclusion of the administration of the oath to the new admittees, the Court then proceeded directly to oral argument of the cases on the docket for the morning.

As many of you are probably aware, the Anna Nicole Smith probate case was one of the cases which was heard by the Court on the morning we were inducted. The other case was a Vermont case, dealing with a Vermont state law which sought to limit campaign expenditures. Both cases were heard by the Court, and the arguments of counsel and the inter-play between the justices and counsel was quite something to observe. Of course, as a result of the Anna Nicole Smith case being argued that day, a media village had been created outside the front steps of the Court building, with television cameras and television personalities from around the United States and the world waiting outside to file their reports. Inside the courtroom, there is no television coverage permitted, and the press section was packed with reporters from the media, and a number of courtroom artists. The morning's proceedings concluded shortly after noon, and the courtroom was filled to capacity during the entire session.

We will commence at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, March 17, 2006 with the Bench and Bar Conference, with lunch to begin at the normal time, and the Bench and Bar Conference to continue following lunch and up to approximately 3:00 or 3:30 p.m. On March 30, 2006, at the Marriott Hutchinson Island, formerly known as Indian River Plantation, Paul Clement, the Solicitor General of the United States will be our guest speaker at a dinner to be held that evening. Please RSVP to the Bar Association phone line as early as possible, so that we have an accurate count on the number of attendees. Our April 21, 2006 luncheon will have a number of speakers. A representative from the Guardian ad Litem program will speak, as will a representative from Project Graduation, and our Circuit's family law judges will make a presentation during that luncheon as well. Our May 19, 2006 luncheon will feature Alan Bookman, the President of the Florida Bar, and we have scheduled our annual dinner for Saturday evening, June 24, 2006, and we are expecting retired Florida Supreme Court Justice Major B. Harding to be our guest speaker for the annual dinner. Last, and certainly not least with regard to the events for the balance of the year, the 4th annual President's Cup Golf Tournament of the Martin County Bar Association will take place on June 3, 2006, and any information with regard to that event can be obtained from Jack Sobel, the Founding Father of our golf tournament.

Local Lawyer receives Floridas Bar President's Pro Bono Service Award

Local Lawyer Honored for Providing Free Legal Services to the Poor Twenty Lawyers from around the State of Florida have received the Florida Bar President's Pro Bono Service Award for their commitment to providing free legal services to the poor. The awards ceremony took place at the Florida Supreme Court on Thursday, February 16, 2006. The Florida Bar President's Pro Bono Service Award was established in 1981 as a way to recognize individual lawyers within Florida's judicial circuits who are committed to providing free legal services to those who cannot afford legal fees. The term "pro bono," derived from the Latin phrase "pro bono publico," means "for the good of the public."

Our local winner, Brian Connelly, was presented with the LB Vocelle Pro Bono Service Award at the December Bar Association Holiday Event. At that time, he found out that his work made him eligible for the Florida Bar President's Awards that were distributed last week. Mr. Connelly served as the Indian River County Pro Bono Liaison for the Indian River Bar Association and regularly handles cases from Florida Rural Legal Services, Inc. A determination if a person is eligible for free legal services is made by applying the federally mandated poverty guidelines.

Florida Rural Legal Services, Inc. provides' free legal services to indigent individuals who could not otherwise afford an attorney either through in house representation or through the Pro Bono project. Throughout his legal career, Mr. Connelly has handled more than 75 Pro Bono cases, donating more than 500 hours of free legal services to the poor.
